before the Hijrah\* to Madinah.

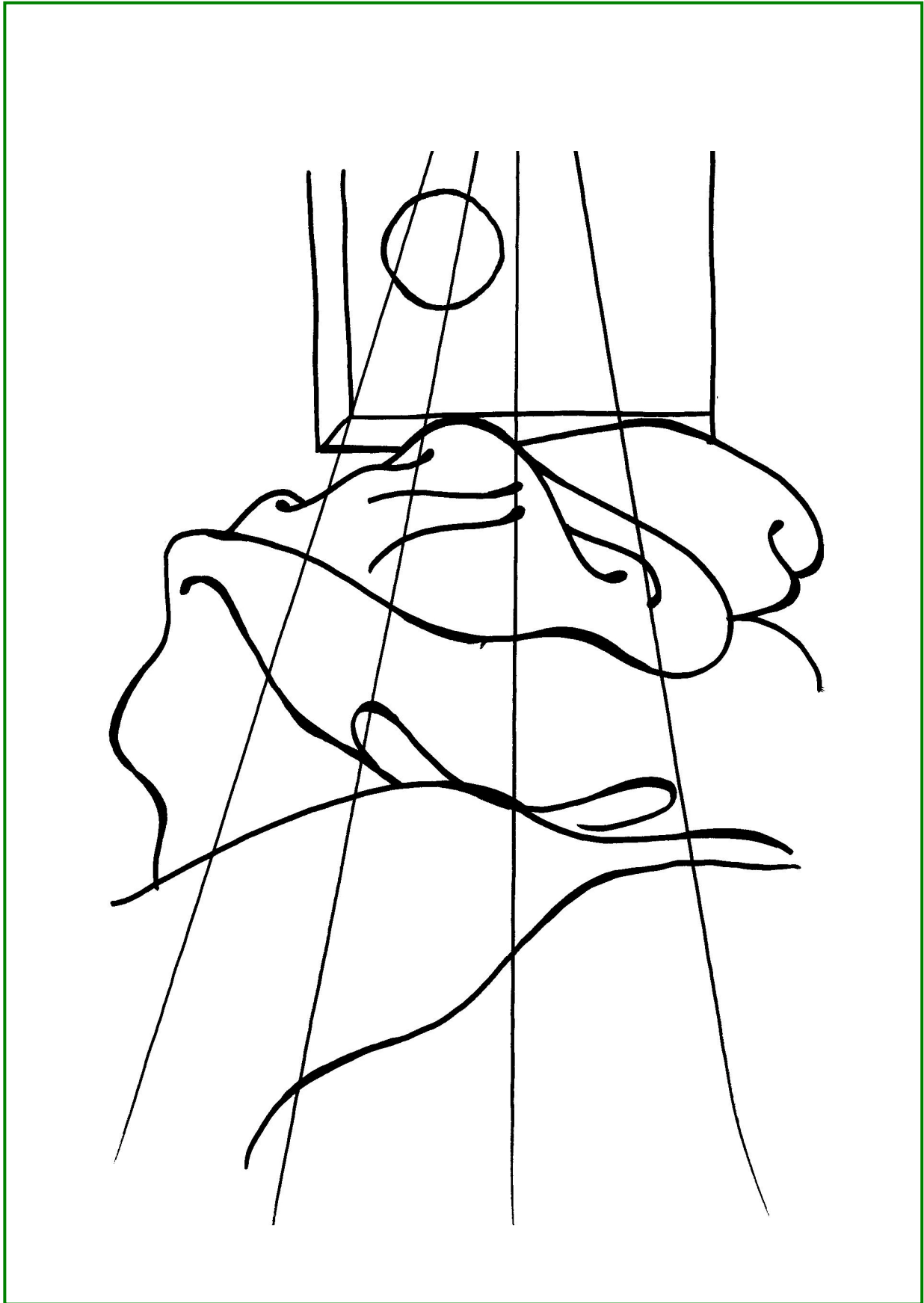
Suratul-Moozzummil tells us about **Tahajjood**  
and **Qiyaamul-Layl** (prayers done at night after  
Isha, but before Fajr)

Suratul-Moozzummil teaches us about how  
Rasulullahﷺ used to get messages from  
Angel Gibreel.

## What is Suratul-Moozzummil about?

**Suratul-Moozzummil is all about how  
important the night prayers are, and  
how Allah will make things easy for us  
if we make them regularly.**

*\*Hijrah is the journey Rasulallahﷺ (and all those who followed him) made to Madinah after teaching Islam in  
Makkah for many years and being rejected by his people. After the Hijrah Rasulallahﷺ established the Islamic State  
in Madinah and eventually returned to peacefully conquer Makkah.*



Now let's learn what  
Suratul-Moozzummil  
says...

In the name of Allah, the Beneficent, the Merciful.

بِسْمِ اللَّهِ  
الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

We start  
Suratul-Moozzummil  
by remembering Allah.

O thou folded in garments!

يَا أَيُّهَا الْمَزْمَلُ

Stand (to prayer) by night, but not all night,-

قُمِ اللَّيْلَ إِلَّا قَلِيلًا

Allah starts this surah by  
talking to Rasulallahﷺ...

Allah told Rasulallahﷺ to get up out of his bed (at night  
when everyone else is sleeping) and to make the  
**night prayers.**

The night prayers are called ...

**'Qj-yaam-mool-Layl'**

(if you do it after Isha, but before you go to bed)

Or

**'Ta-haj-jood'**

(if you wake up after sleeping a little and make prayers before Fajr).

When Allah sent this verse to Rasulallahﷺ, he started  
making night prayers right away. Making night prayers  
was something that Rasulallahﷺ **had to do** because he  
was a prophet.

Half of it,- or a little less,

نِصْفَهُ أَوْ انْقُصْ مِنْهُ قَلِيلًا

Allah told  
Rasulullahﷺ...

That he should pray about half the night, but if it was a little more or a little less that was okay.

So Rasulullahﷺ (and the Sahaba) started praying the night prayers every night.

Rasulullahﷺ always did what Allah told him to do right away, without asking any questions or feeling sad that he had something new that needed to be done.

That is why Allah loved  
Rasulullahﷺ so much.
