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Lesson 21: Connecting Zhau

Part 1: What You Need to Know

What does Zhau look like when it is connected to other letters in a word?

Zhau looks different depending on where it is in a word. Below are some examples of how Zhau changes in the beginning, middle and end of a word. **Important!** Zhau looks very similar to Tau, which we studied, in the last lesson; the only difference between the letters is the dot on top of Zhau. Zhau is pronounced as a combination of d, z, and th mixed together.

Memory Hint: “Zhau looks like the sun rising above the Masjid at Zhuhur time.”



Alone



End

At the end of a word Zhau has a tail to join it to the letter that comes before it.



Middle

In the middle of a word Zhau has two tails (one on each side) to join it to the letters that comes before and after it.



Beginning

At the beginning of a word Zhau has a tail to join it to the letter that comes after it.

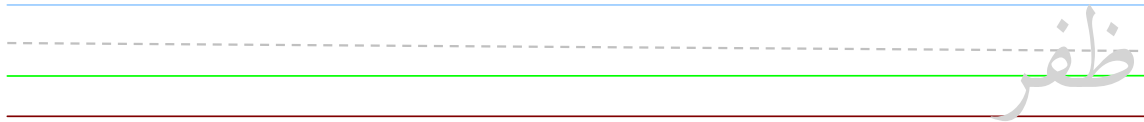

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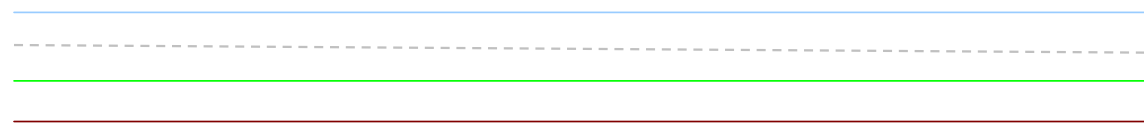
Part V: Writing Practice

Now if you need more of a challenge try to write each word by yourself!

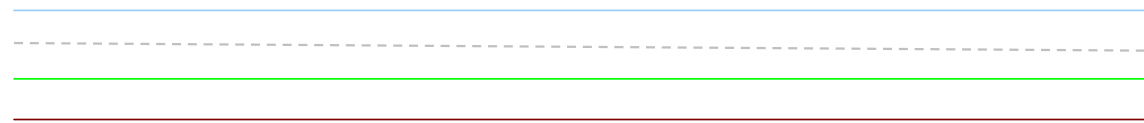
