How to Use this Answer Key

The Level G Answer Key includes answers to all questions in the lesson assessments that the student will complete as part of the course. This Answer Key and Grade Book are for the use of the parent or home teacher, and should be kept in a separate location from the student guides and other course materials.

Answer Key Features

Each Answer Key is labeled with the Unit number and Lesson number. The key has subject headings and the questions and/or assignments that the student should have completed for the Lesson Assessment. Each question also includes the page number in the text where the answer can be found to assist you in showing the student where to find the correct answer for any question/s that he/she may have answered incorrectly.

Answer Format

The answers given in this key are brief notes of the main points that should be covered; they are not in the format that should be expected of the student. The student is expected to answer all questions in complete sentences, unless otherwise noted. Answers should also be complete, with correct spelling and grammar.

Grading the Student's Answers

The student has been informed in the student guide of exactly how to prepare assignments (see Appendix A, B and C in the Student Guides). You should look over this information so that you know what is expected of the student. When grading the student's assignments the following items should not be allowed:

- One word answers
- Incomplete sentences
- Spelling mistakes
- Grammatical errors

You can choose to deduct points for these errors or (as we highly recommend) have the student redo the assignment to correct any mistakes before issuing a final grade.

Special Note for Arabic

The answers for the Arabic Worksheets have not been included in the answer key, as most of these assignments require the student to search for certain items in the Qur'aan, and there is no way to know ahead of time what answers the student may choose to use on the worksheets. Therefore, the parent or home teacher will need to evaluate the worksheets separately.

This task may seem intimidating at first, but you will soon realize that the worksheets are designed in such a way that even parents with a limited knowledge of Arabic should be able to grade the worksheets and in the process learn many important aspects of Qur'aanic Arabic, and Allah knows best.

Qur'aan Assessment

Although Qur'aan assignments are not graded and are not required for graduation, we encourage you to have the student memorize the assigned ayaat. If the student has memorized the ayaat, then you can take this time to test their memorization.

Assigned Ayaat Suratul-Ma'idah (5) 82-89

Tafseer Assessment

In an essay of 500 words or more, the student should give a summary of the Tafseer for the ayaat studied in this lesson. The following main ideas should be included.

Essay should include the following: The story of An-Najashi, the Ethiopian King and his delegation to Rasulullah (saw), the status of Jews and Christians and their relationship with the Muslims, unintentional oaths, and the expiation for breaking oaths.
