How to Use These Books

The Mini Tafseer Book Series is designed to teach children the Tafseer (exegesis) of all the suwaar (chapters) in the 30th Part of the Qur'aan. Each book in this 38 book series covers a different surah. The books feature:

- Special facts about the surah
- Arabic text of the surah
- English transliteration (to assist non-Arabic speakers)
- English translation
- Simplified Tafseer
- Coloring pages
- Highlighted Arabic vocabulary (linked to Ad-Duha Qur'aan lessons)
- One sentence summary of what the surah is about
- Review section
- Notes on the text (additional facts and information)

Teaching Tips:

If your younger child has trouble going through the whole book in one sitting, or does not retain all of the information taught, then just focus on the Tafseer pages first (i.e. those that explain the verses of the surah) and save the additional information contained in the Quick Facts, What's Special, Asbaab An-Nuzool, and Vocabulary sections* for later when your child has mastered the Tafseer.

For older or advanced students who need more of a challenge, you can take time to go through all sections and discuss the lesson notes for that section (located at the end of the text). This will make lessons more challenging and provide a deeper understanding of the Tafseer, and Allah knows best.

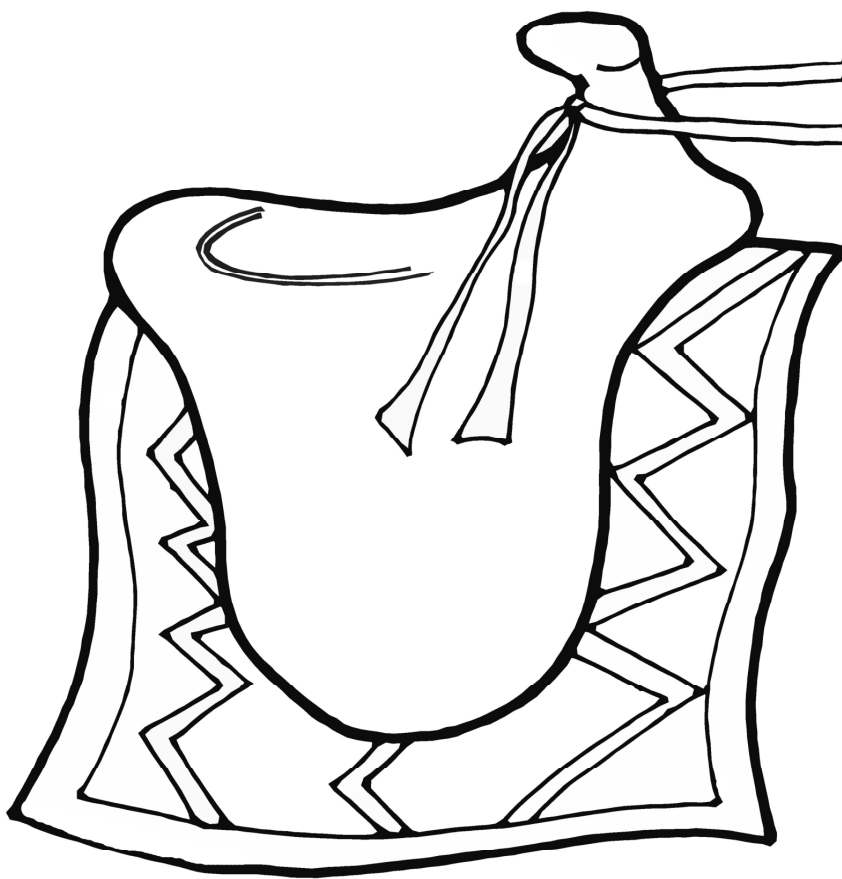

Suratul-'Aadiyaat is so special because...

It is one of the **7 suwaar** in the Qur'aan
named after **animals**.

In this case, 'Aadiyaat is a
description of **HORSES!**
(i.e. those that run/race, or the horses
used in Jihaad).



If you **love animals**, there's **a lot** in the Qur'aan about them.

The animals mentioned in the Qur'aan usually are **doing things Allah has told them to do**, being used as **examples** that we can learn lessons from, or are mentioned due to the **benefits or harm** Allah has put in them for us.

The seven suwaar (chapters) named after animals are²...

1. Suratul-'Aadiyaat
(those that run/race, i.e. horses)
2. Suratul-'Ankaboot (Spider)
3. Suratul-'An'aam (Cattle)
4. Suratul-Baqarah (Cow)
5. Suratul-Feel (Elephant)
6. Suratun-Naml (Ant)
7. Suratun-Nahl (Bee)

And that is not all! There are plenty of other animals mentioned in the Qur'aan that do not have surahs named after them like camels, donkeys, mules, birds, sheep, snakes, lions, dogs, pigs, apes, flies, locusts, worms, lice, frogs, and fish, too!...**WOW!**

Do you know what Allah says about these animals?

If not, look up their stories (use the chart on the next page to start with). Soon you will be an expert!

Bonus Question:

There is one animal mentioned in the Qur'aan that is not listed on the chart, can you figure out its name?

Hint: It is mentioned in the story of Prophet Yusuf عليه السلام. When you find the answer, write it below.

Extra Credit:

When you read each story, decide what the animal story is about, and choose which of the options below to write next to each animal's name.

(You can choose more than one).

- A.** Doing things Allah has told them to do.
- B.** An example for us to learn from.
