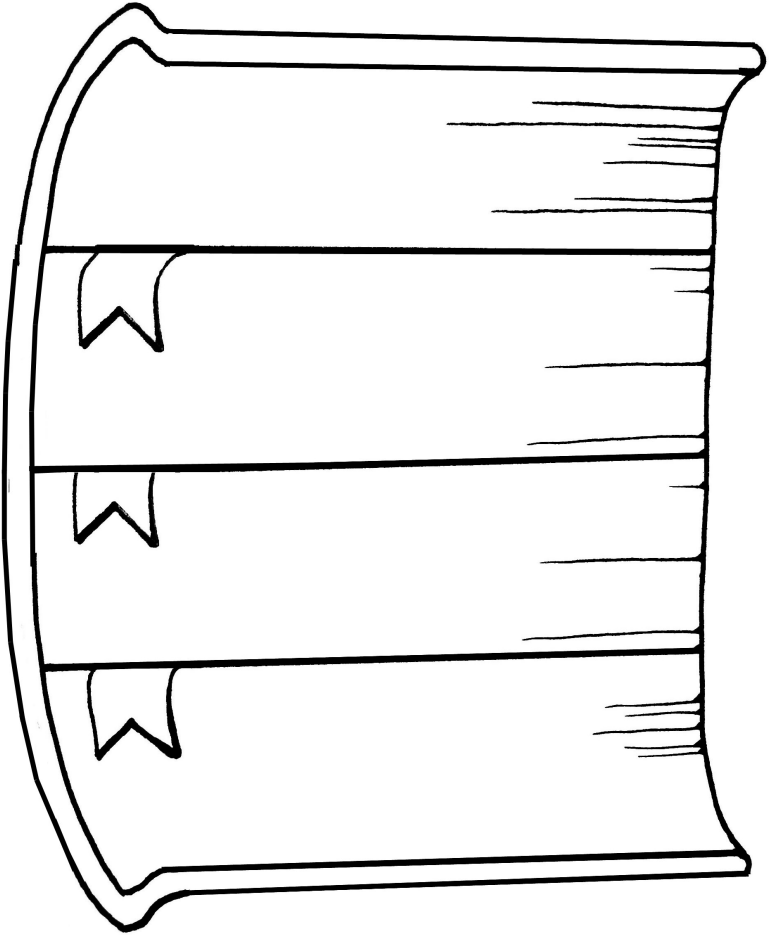
The first thing that is **so special** about Suratun-Nasr is that Rasulullahﷺ said reading it is equal to reading...

The second thing that is **so special** about Suratun-Nasr is that...

**It was the last surah
revealed to Rasulullahﷺ.**

Angel Gibreel came to teach Rasulullahﷺ small parts of the Qur'aan almost every day for **23 years**. When Angel Gibreel taught Rasulullahﷺ Suratun-Nasr, it was the last surah⁵ that **Angel Gibreel** would bring him.

Although, there were a few other ayat (verses) that Angel Gibreel brought later to add to other suwaar that were almost finished, **no new surah** was revealed after Suratun-Nasr. ⁶

**That is one of the reasons that
Suratun-Nasr is so special!**

The third thing that is **so special** about Suratun-Nasr is that...

Suratun-Nasr was revealed during the Hajjatul-Wadaa'.

You see Rasulullahﷺ left Makkah during the Hijrah and went to live in Madinah. He always wanted to go back and make Hajj in Makkah, but he was not able to until **10 years later.**⁷

When Rasulullahﷺ finally was able to go for Hajj, there were **thousands of Muslims** who went with him, Al-Hamdulillah!

This Hajj is now known as the **Hajjatul-Wadaa'** (Farewell Pilgrimage), because Rasulullahﷺ never made another Hajj after it.

You might think that everyone was happy to make Hajj with Rasulullahﷺ, and in the beginning they were, but that was soon to change...

After the Hajj rituals were finished, everyone went to stay in a valley just outside of Makkah called **Mina**. They stayed in that place for three days.

These three days in Mina are called, **Ayaamut-Tashreeq.**

During these days, Rasulullahﷺ and the Muslims would go each day to throw stones at three pillars in the valley that represent Shaytaan, and at night they would sleep in **tents**.

It was during these days in Mina that Allah revealed Suratun-Nasr to Rasulullahﷺ.

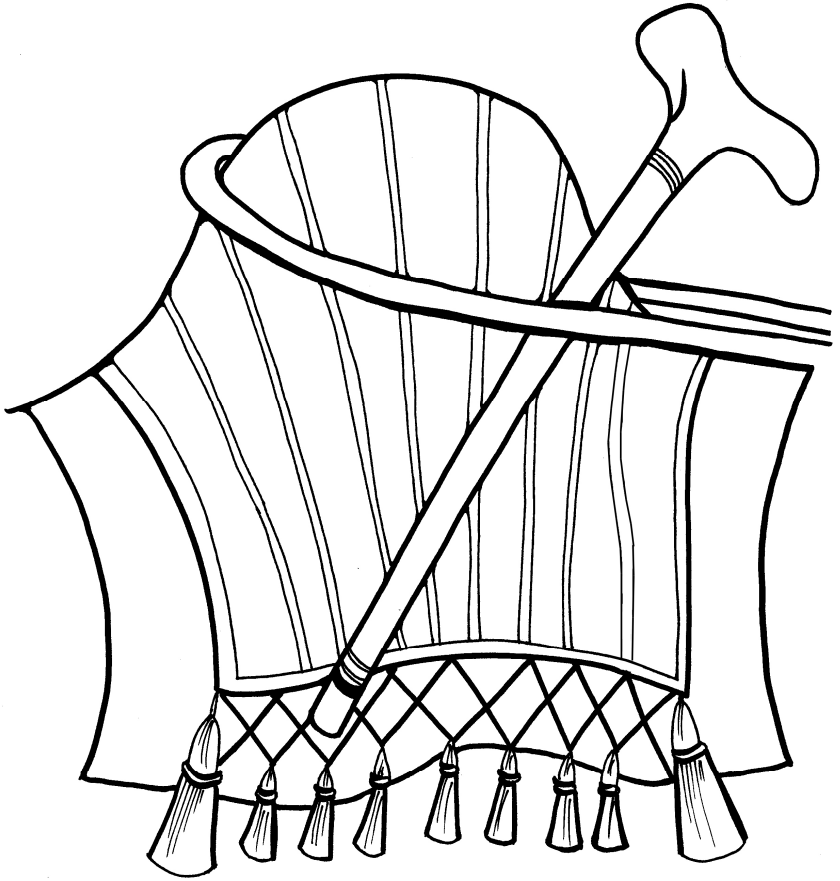
After Rasulullah ﷺ received Suratun-Nasr, he rode his camel out to a wide, open place called **Mount Arafat** and had the people gathered around him so that he could talk to them.

He gave a talk to the people while still sitting on the **back of his camel**.⁸

This talk he gave is called **Khutbatul-Wadaa'**⁹ (Farewell Sermon)

Wadaa', means to say goodbye, and this speech was given that name because during it Rasulullah ﷺ said **goodbye to all of the Muslims**.

When the Muslims heard this, their happiness turned to sadness.
